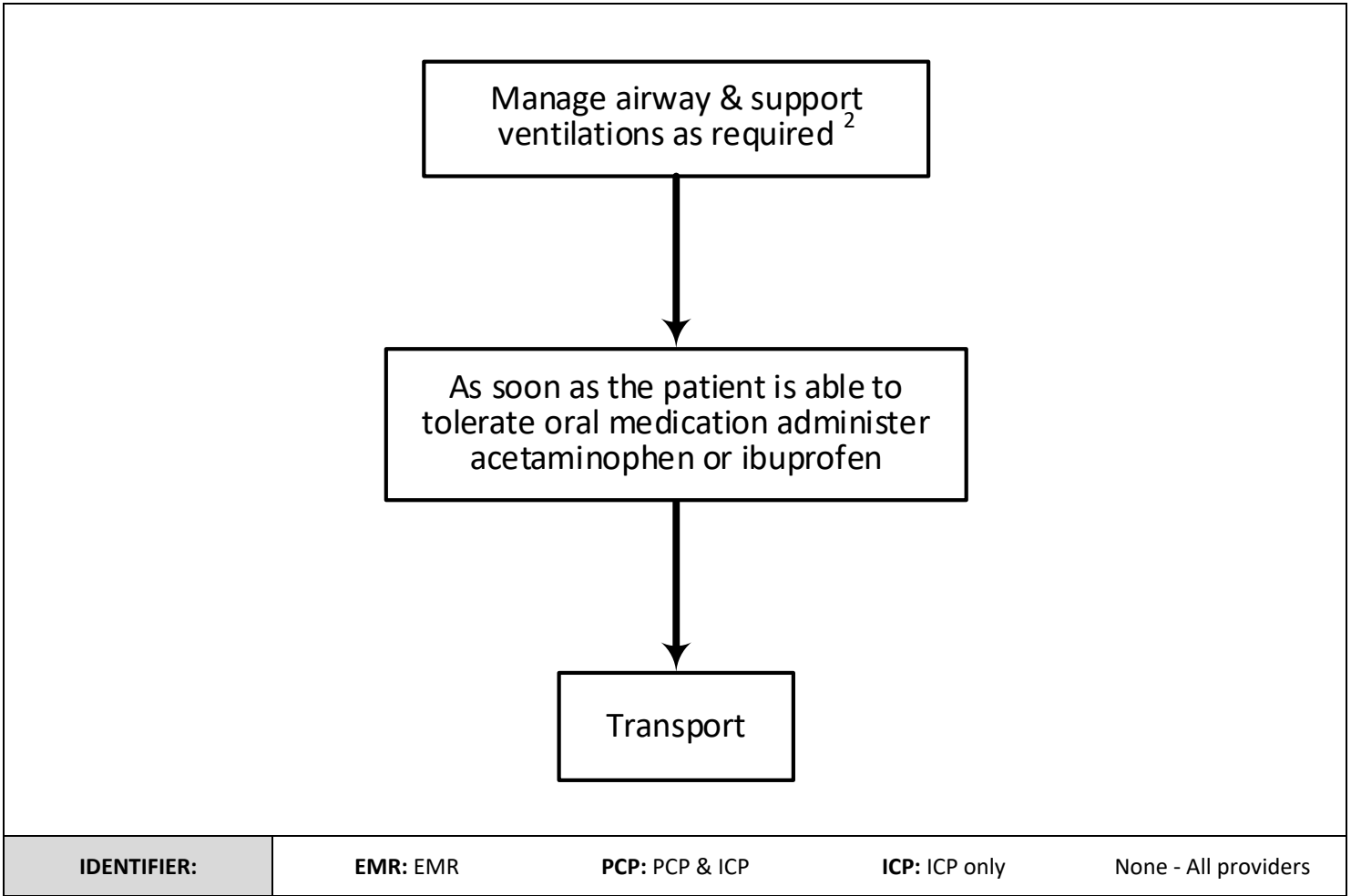

| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Benign febrile seizures are usually brief (less than ten minutes), self-limited, rarely recur, and do not require anticonvulsant medications. They are rare after early childhood. 2. Respiratory depression, hypoxemia and airway compromise are uncommon after the seizure has aborted. |
