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This process/guideline is to be used to assess and prioritize disinfectants when supply chain issues arise.

Step	Shortages
2	If a shortage occurs of Accel Intervention RTU Wipes, Oxivir TB RTU Liquid will be used with Dry Wipe System. Refer to Standard Operating Procedure (SOP): Accelerated Hydrogen Peroxide Dry Wipe System. Available at: https://sharedhealthmb.ca/files/ahp-reusable-system-sop.pdf Sites to begin saving 1 litre bottles of Accel Intervention and Oxivir TB for possible decanting from larger containers into 1 litre bottles. A notification will be sent out to start this process. Sites to begin to reprocessing 1 litre bottles and decant from larger containers into 1 litre bottes, depending on threshold/triggers. A notification will be sent out to start this process. Sites to begin consideration of Prevention RTU Wipes and/or Liquid or Oxivir Plus to be used in specific areas. This will require a multi-disciplinary team that includes, but not limited to: Infection Prevention and Control Facility Management Materials Management Areas to consider would be conference/meeting rooms, staff rooms, public corridors, offices The following cloths can be used with liquid product. Selection should be appropriate to the setting (e.g. laundered, disposable): Microfibre, cotton cloths, j-cloths, paper towel
	*If shortages continue, alternative disinfectants may need to be considered (e.g. alternative AHP products).
