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



Educational program which virtually connects Primary Care Practitioners (PCPs; "spokes") with Specialists ("Hub Team") • Hub Team members share expertise with PCPs who then provide improved care to patients in their own communities Case-based learning, interdisciplinary guidance from Hub Team and spokes, collaborative learning (All Teach, All Learn)

Implementation in Manitoba

Our journey started in August 2019; we officially launched in September 2021. We have had a total of 8 cycles and 238 registrants to date.


