

New updates to the COVID-19 Unvaccinated Clients Report

In early March, the weekly COVID-19 Unvaccinated Clients report was replaced with the COVID-19 Unvaccinated and Unboosted Clients report.

This report includes:

- A provider-based and age-grouped list of unvaccinated and partially vaccinated patients, with the addition of those aged 18+ who have NOT received a third dose/booster and whose last dose is >6 months and are not scheduled to receive a COVID-19 vaccination in the next 30 days.
- Additional columns entitled Second Dose Date, Second Dose Vaccine, and Anticipated Action.

This scheduled report is available in PDF and Microsoft Excel formats and will be updated on a weekly basis.

To reduce the risk of interruptions to Shared Health services (e.g., eChart, eHealth_hub, etc), return the completed [Clinic Change form](#) four weeks prior to any changes, such as:

- Ownership or legal name
- EMR vendor
- Internet service provider
- Moving a clinic to another location



eChart 2022 is Coming Soon

eChart Manitoba is preparing to migrate approximately 16,000 users to eChart 2022 in the coming months. Authorized Sponsors will receive email communications from eChart Manitoba with details regarding access to eChart 2022.

Why is the upgrade needed?

The current version of eChart runs on Internet Explorer (IE) which will be at its end-of-life soon. eChart 2022 accommodates modern browsers. As well, an upgrade is required to continue with vendor support.

What else will be different with eChart 2022?

eChart 2022 has a brand-new look and feel that empowers the user to customize their view and save time by accessing clinical information in an easy-to-read format.

Features include:

- The ability to personalize display preferences and save them as a default
 - Category View – grouped by clinical domains (e.g., Labs Medications, Immunizations, etc.)
 - View by Date – reverse chronological order
- Option to select between three different text sizes
- Ability to set default view for preferred categories
- Adjustable window size to take advantage of full screen real estate - no more white space

As an eChart user, how can I familiarize myself with eChart 2022?

Users are strongly encouraged to watch the eChart 2022 eLearning video before using eChart 2022. It will be made available on the eChart Manitoba website at the beginning of May.
