











## High-Alert Medications PARENTERAL ANTICOAGULANTS

The following parenteral anticoagulants are provincially recognized High-Alert Medications. They require Independent Double-Checks by Visual Verification.



All continuous infusions are High-Alert



All doses prepared in patient care areas are High-Alert



**EXCEPTION**: IV direct, IV intermittent and subcutaneous when prepared by pharmacy or in a prefilled syringe

argatroban, bivalirudin, danaparoid, enoxaparin, eptifibatide, fondaparinux, heparin\*

IV/subcutaneous

\*EXCEPTION: heparin IV intermittent and subcut when prepared by pharmacy or in a 5000 unit prefilled syringe/vial or when used for CVAD maintenance

dalteparin, tinzaparin

subcutaneous/IV during hemodialysis

Limiting the availability of high-dose formats of anticoagulants is an important safety practice that minimizes the risk of patient/client harm.
