Report an adverse event by completing the Manitoba Health Report of Adverse Events Following Immunization (AEFI) form and submit to the Medical Officer of Health by fax and/or email. Reports the AEFI within seven days of becoming aware of a reportable event Reports a serious AEFI within one business day: an event that is lifethreatening, could result in permanent disability, requires hospitalization or urgent medical attention, or for any other reason is considered to be of a serious nature Follow SDO process for inputting of vaccinations into the Public Health Immunization Monitoring System (PHMIS) database (e.g., submitting to public health, input directly at

site).
