

QUICK REFERENCE: OUTBREAK MANAGEMENT

Note: where the term patient is used, it shall be interpreted as referring to patient, resident, or client.

DO YOU HAVE A POSSIBLE OUTBREAK?
□ Call IP&C/designate.
On weekends/after hours, follow site/region/SDO specific notification process. Initial information to be reported:
 □ Total number of symptomatic patients □ Onset date of initial cases □ Location of outbreak in facility □ Control measures implemented □ Laboratory or diagnostics completed as ordered by site primary care provider

IMPLEMENT <u>ADDITIONAL PRECAUTIONS</u> AND OTHER OUTBREAK MANAGEMENT MEASURES

	OTHER OUTBREAK MANAGEMENT MEASURES
	Place ILI/respiratory illness case on Droplet/Contact Precautions (considering COVID-19 context also use Airborne for any AGMPs)
	Place COVID-19 case on Droplet/Contact Precautions with Airborne for AGMPs
	Place GI illness case on Contact Precautions (considering context of COVID-19 use Droplet/Contact Precautions with Airborne for any AGMPs)
	<u>Cohort</u> cases away from those not ill (minimum 2m separation between ill and those without symptoms)
	Ensure supplies of ABHR, PPE (gowns, gloves, masks, eye protection), and cleaning/disinfecting supplies are available
	Increase cleaning and disinfection of frequently touched areas to at least twice daily and when visibly soiled
	Promote hand hygiene measures and cough etiquette with staff, patients, family and visitors
	Dedicate equipment or ensure equipment is cleaned/disinfected before use with another patient
	Visitation
	General visitors are not permitted during an outbreak, except in End of Life situations
	 Designated Caregiver (DC) should continue to occur virtually wherever possible. In- person visitation is considered in order to meet care needs of resident/patient.
	Restrict movement of patients within the facility, with discontinuation of all non-essential activities, including communal activities



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COLLECT SPECIMENS		
□ Collect specimens as recommended by IP&C/designate:		
If ILI or COVID-19 Outbreak – ensure nasopharyngeal (NP) swabs and universal transport medium are available		
 Respiratory Virus Specimen Collection If GI Outbreak – ensure preservative free containers are available for stool specimens. Gastrointestinal Illness (GI) Outbreak Specimen Collection 		
☐ Regional/SDO IP&C/designate to obtain outbreak code. This is to be included on ALL specimen lab requisitions		
☐ Label specimens URGENT and ask staff to transport as a priority		
DOCUMENT THE OUTBREAK SYMPTOMS IN THE HEALTH RECORD AND CREATE A LINE LIST		
☐ Details of symptoms must be either well documented and/or line listed with demographic information		
☐ Ensure documentation and/or line lists are updated daily with any new cases or suspect		
cases ☐ Update documentation and/or line lists with any positive specimen results		
NOTIFICATIONS		
☐ Share line listing with IP&C/designate daily; include any deaths. Deaths associated with an outbreak must be reported to Manitoba Health (MH) via their notification form		
 □ Notify Materials Management/Supply Chain a possible increase in supplies may be needed □ In all sites, IP&C/designate will communicate initial and final update to applicable stakeholders and report as required to the region/MH using CNPHI 		
INTERACTIONS BETWEEN STAFF AND PEOPLE RECEIVING CARE		
☐ Strive to have individual staff members working with either ill or well patients. When they must work with both, as much as possible staff should move from asymptomatic to symptomatic patients ensuring adherence to Routine Practices and Additional Precautions when required		
SHARING OF INFORMATION AND EDUCATION		
 □ Inform appropriate facility staff that an outbreak is occurring □ At start of outbreak investigation, check with IP&C/designate regarding placing signage at unit/area/facility entrances □ Educate patients and visitors/designated caregivers regarding outbreak measures 		
PREPARE FOR POSSIBLE ANTIVIRAL TREATMENT		
ACCORDING TO IDENTIFIED ORGANISM		
☐ If LTC, locate the precalculated dosages for oseltamivir and have available should the Attending physician/PCH Medical Director/MOH order/recommend prophylaxis if a confirmed influenza outbreak		
☐ If applicable, inform pharmacy for potential increase of antivirals and immunizations
