

### **After Receiving a Blood Product**

While in hospital you received a blood product. On rare occasions, you may have a reaction. The reaction may happen while you are receiving the blood product, while you are still in the hospital or even a few hours or days later. You were carefully watched while receiving the blood product. It is important that you know what to watch for once you go home.

### If you have any of the following symptoms:

- Flushed and feeling warm
- Chills or shaking
- Rash, hives or itching
- Nausea or vomiting
- An unusual headache, backache or abdominal pain
- Problems breathing and/or feeling short of breath
- Blood in your urine (will look light brown or rust colored)
- Jaundice (skin will look yellow)

These symptoms should be treated as soon as possible so they do not become more serious.

# If your symptoms are mild and you are not sure what to do:

## If your symptoms are serious and you feel unwell:

- Call 911 for immediate medical assistance.
- DO NOT DRIVE YOURSELF!

If you do need to go to the Emergency
Department bring this pamphlet and the
wallet card *Patient Notification Record: Administration of Blood/Blood Products* that you received when you were
discharged from the hospital. Let the staff know
that you may be having a reaction to a blood
product.

\*Note: The hospital where you received your blood product must be notified about the reaction.
