Why use a story board?

5S storyboards are meant to provide others with a snapshot of the improvements being made and catch the attention of the staff that are not on the project team by showing them before and after.

It is similar to the idea behind a project charter that someone should be able to read it and understand at a high level, what was completed and what the results are.

When to use a story board?

A story board is required when the 5S tool is used.

How to create your story board:

Using poster board, create 5 story boards, one for each step of 5S and highlight what was done in each step. Numerous pictures should be included on the storyboard and highlight what was done. For example, during the 'Sort' phase highlight the number of expired items, unique items found or amount of paper removed.
