SPREAD PLAN ENGAGEMENT STRATEGIES T

There are several engagement strategies. Others, may use all, develop others or deploy none. As a team determine the right strategy for each area. (Refer to Spread Plan Template).

Engagement is more than talking to people, it is purposeful planning and communication.

Steps to Achieving Spread

Steps	
Present 'Report Out Presentation' to all staff	This is a powerful tool for engaging others. It describes the improvement journey and provides the qualitative and quantitative evidence for the change
Process Map the Current State	Walk staff through the original current state map (from the pilot project) and identify similarities and differences in the process. If a Future State Map was developed, sharing it and comparing it with the Current State map clearly illustrates the incorporated changes.
Collect Baseline Measures	If the area has skeptics, baseline measures can be taken to quantify the improvement in the area to help with buy-in
Tour of Pilot Project Area for All Staff	Arranging a tour of the pilot area is a great way to engage staff. It allows them to talk with staff in the areas about the changes and their thoughts around the improvements
Other	Team may develop other strategies to help with engagement

It is a good idea to have participants from the location(s) that the pilot will be spread to as participants or "special guests" on the team. This is a great way to reduce resistance to implementing the spread plan.
