This safe work procedure was created by Safe Patient Handling Safe Work Procedure and will be reviewed any time the task, equipment or materials change and at a minimum of every three years from the last revision date.

Notes/Other Considerations:

- More than 2 HCWs may be required if:
 - Greater than minimal assistance is required by each HCW. Additional procedures and/or equipment may be required (e.g. tube or sheet slider, mechanical lift, repositioning sling)
 - Low or High Muscle Tone is present
 - Patient care equipment or devices are being used (e.g. Casts, I.V. poles)
 - Recent surgery or fracture
- If behavior interferes with care, alternate procedures and/or equipment may be required
- Once sling has been inserted, ensure that leg straps are positioned appropriately (i.e. crossed) as per manufacturers guidelines in preparation for attachment to mechanical lift

Note: Inspect the sling for signs of damage prior to use.

Steps to be taken to complete task safely:

Place bed flat. Ensure brakes are applied and lower side rails. Position bed at waist height of shortest HCW. If performing on floor, kneel on one leg.

Option 1: Manual Turn (patient can assist)

1a	Ask patient to bend knee furthest from direction of turn or cross the legs at the ankle. Ask patient to pull on aids if available (e.g., bed rail) and/or push foot into bed (as able) to turn onto side.					
	If patient requires minimal assist to turn, HCWs are positioned on either side of patient. HCW#1 pushes patient towards HCW#2 by shifting weight up and forward. Other HCWs available assist with pushing patient. HCW#2 assists with turn and maintains patient in side lying.					
1b	HCW #1 places center of sling along spine of patient. Ensure sling is positioned according to manufacturer's instructions (e.g., tailbone). HCW #1 stands at side of bed with wide base of support, one foot in front of the other. With one side of sling draped over patient, HCW #1 tucks/folds remaining portion of the sling underneath patient. Once patient is on their back, HCW #2 pulls edges of sling through to opposite side. Turn towards opposite side if needed to pull sling through.					
	TO REMOVE SLING:					
	HCW #1 tucks/folds nearest edge of sling underneath patient. Once patient is on their back, HCW #2 pulls edges of sling through. Turn patient towards opposite side if needed to pull sling through.					
	Option 2: Turn With Equipment (e.g., sliders, repositioning sling)					
	(patient cannot assist)					
2a	With patient in side lying following turn with sliders, HCW#2 maintains patient in place while HCW#1 positions sling against patient's body as in Option 1. Alternatively, a repositioning sling can be used to turn patient where applicable.

2b	HCW#1 lowers patient onto back while HCW#2 pulls top slider towards them. Once patient is on their back, pull edges of sling through to opposite side. Turn towards opposite side if needed to pull sling through.

	TO REMOVE SLING:					
	HCW #1 tucks/folds nearest edge of sling underneath patient. Once patient is on their back, HCW #2 pulls					
	edges of sling through. Turn patient towards opposite side if needed to pull sling through.					
	Option 3: Sling Insertion From Head (slider sheets only)					
3a	HCWs stand on opposite sides of bed with sliders in place under patient. Slide bottom edge of sling opening between the slider sheets under patient's head and shoulders.					
3b	Both HCWs face the head of the bed with wide base of support, one leg in front of the other. Together, HCWs grasp top slider with outside hand and pull tight. HCWs grasp sling with inside hand and shift weight from front to back foot to pull sling between sliders. Ensure sling is positioned according to manufacturer's instructions (e.g., tailbone).					
3c	Adjust sling position as necessary. Remove slider(s).					
	TO REMOVE SLING:					
	Place a single slider sheet onto bed before lowering patient using lift. Insert					
	second slider sheet between sling and patient using folding/unfolding method.					
	HCW #1 and HCW#2 stand facing foot of the bed with wide base of support					
	and one foot in front of the other. Grasp the bottom of the body of the sling					
	and pull the sling upwards towards head of bed.					
	Option 4: Sling Insertion From Side (slider sheets only)					
4a						
44	HCWs stand on opposite side of bed with sliders in place under patient. HCW#1 passes one shoulder strap behind patient's neck, and one leg strap under patient's low back, between sliders.					



4b	Once straps are fed through, HCW #1 grasps top slider and holds tight. HCW #2 stands on HCW#2 stand on opposite side of bed with wide base of support, one foot in front of the other facing patient. HCW #2 grasps strap(s) and weight shifts backwards, pulling sling between sliders into position.					
4c	Adjust sling position as necessary. Remove top slider before transferring patient.					
	TO REMOVE SLING:					
	Place a single slider sheet onto bed before lowering patient using lift. Insert second slider sheet between sling and patient using folding/unfolding method. Use method above to remove sling.

NOTE: If there are no skin integrity concerns, the following alternative method for sling removal may be used

- HCWs stand on opposite side of bed facing foot of bed with wide base of support, one foot in front of the other. One hand grasps leg strap with other hand stabilizing sling.
- Tuck leg strap underneath itself and guide towards head of bed. HCWs communicate and shift weight from front to back leg at the same time while guiding leg strap. Repeat until sling is removed.
