INDICATIONS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Administration of scheduled oral ⁵ and parenteral ⁶ medications during interfacility transfer.

CONTRAINDICATIONS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All contraindications must be addressed by the prescribing provider.

DOSING
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Dose, administration route, repeat dose and dosing interval will be established by the prescribing provider. ²

NOTES
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Paramedics must always operate within their College of Paramedics of Manitoba (CPMB) scope of practice. This document is not a standing order. A written order from the <u>prescribing</u> provider is required. The written order constitutes a <i>temporary</i> increase in the EMS/PT scope of work for the duration of that patient encounter only. Paramedics will not comply with an order that they know to be wrong, inaccurate, or illegible. Paramedics with the basic (EMR), primary (PCP), & intermediate (ICP) work scopes may administer all <u>scheduled</u> oral medications. Paramedics with the intermediate (ICP) work scope may initiate and administer all <u>scheduled</u> parenteral medications. The on-line medical support (OLMS) physician may be able to assist with <i>interim</i> order(s), if the prescribing provider cannot be reached.
